Johannus Orgelbouw B.V. is a very special company manufacturing famous church organs. It is located in Ede, Holland, a city in the middle of the Netherlands. To find one of the worlds largest builders of church organs in Holland is no coincidence. The church organ has been an integral part of Dutch history and culture for centuries. Because of an overwhelming tradition of superior craftsmanship and tonal quality there is a greater variety of famous pipe organs in Holland than in any other country in the world.

The craftsmen at Johannus Orgelbouw continue this rich tradition of quality as they work with 20th century tools not available to their earlier ancestors. The pleasing tonal quality of the present generation of Johannus organs would not have been possible without the development of "sampling" technology. All Johannus organs are the guaranteed reproduction of original pipes that have created the hallmark quality of the "King of Instruments". These tones are not a random collection of voices recorded from pipe organs. The careful selection of stops and tones recorded, and the ability to harmonize these into a new classical organ skill takes the same type of craftsmanship and skills used by the historical pipe organ builders.

Johannus Orgelbouw now enjoys worldwide recognition and credibility as a builder of classical organs. Prestigious installations can be found in many churches, concert halls and individual homes all over the world. Organ recitalists in many countries have played Johannus organs and continually voice their appreciation and support.

The combination of contemporary Dutch craftsmen, performing artist and a world wide community of appreciative listeners is rapidly making Johannus instruments the first choice in classical organs.

KLAAS JAN MULDER

Klaas Jan Mulder was born in the parsonage in Boven-Hardinxveld, The Netherlands on May 21, 1930, the oldest of 11 children. As a young boy he learned to play the organ and served as organist for divine worship when his father preached.

Mr. Mulder received his first piano and organ lessons at the music school in Zwolle, The Netherlands and at age 15 performed his piano debut playing a recital of music by Grieg.

In 1947 he performed the third piano concerto by Beethoven. His first organ recital was performed in the Reformed Church in Hattern. The Netherlands during World War II.

Later Mr. Mulder studied piano and organ with \overline{Mr} , Jacob Bijster and Jan Ode at the Conservatorium in Amsterdam. After three years he graduated "CUM LAUDE" with virtuoso distinction. After passing a difficult examination administered by the Ministry for Education, Art and Science he was the recipient of a coveted scholarship which allowed him to enjoy one year studying abroad with the famous artist, Eduardo del Pueyo. He has become widely known and loved throughout many countries because of his overwhelming success as a concert artist.

Besides being a famous organist and pianist, Klaas Jan Mulder also conducts several renowned Dutch choirs. In 1960 he became conductor of the Christian Male Choir "Door Eendracht Verbonden" in Kampen and in 1963 he was named conductor of another Christian Male Choir "De Lofzang" in Heerde. He also serves as conductor of the oratorio choir "IMMANUÈL" in Kampen, which made a concert tour to Vienna, Austria in 1991. Mr. Mulder currently performs concerts for KAJEM Radio and Television production creating compositions which combine organ, synthesizer and rhythm. Besides two golden record awards he has received a PLATINUM LP for his prolific recordings which total more that 1,000,000 sold. This achievement is unique in the sales of classical and/or religious music.

In 1983 he celebrated his 25 anniversary as an organist, pianist and conductor. In 1990 he received the silver distinction of the "SOCIÉTÉ ACADEMIQUE D'ÉDUCATION ET D'ENCOURAGEMENT COURONNÉE PAR L'ACADÉMI FRANÇAISE ARTS, SCIENCES ET LETTRES" or his contribution to French organ culture.

On April 26, 1991, her majesty Queen Beatrix appointed him knight of the "Orde van Oranje"

THE GEBROEDERS BROUWER

Rende and Henk Brouwer have been playing together for 20 years. They made their Television debut during a show called "new harvest". Immediately after that show they received a contract at the Dureco Record Company. Today it is hard to imagine any production of national show business without the Brouwer brothers.

Originally both men played as soloists with classical orchestras. Eventually they took a break from their traditional orchestra positions and became a popular performing team.

In December of 1977 they received an invitation from North American Television to perform during a Christmas concert recorded in Grand Rapids, Michigan. In November 1979, they made television recordings for the Dutch Evangelical Community in Israel.

Even though they live quite a distance from each other (according to Dutch thinking) they practice vigorously every day. These efforts are rewarded with a prestigious reputation.
